THE EMS ANGELS AWARDS ACKNOWLEDGE AND HONOUR THE BEST-PERFORMING PREHOSPITAL STROKE CARE PROVIDERS, RECOGNISING THE HARD WORK THAT GOES INTO RAISING THE STANDARD OF STROKE TREATMENT AND IMPROVING THE LIVES OF STROKE PATIENTS.

Every 30 minutes a stroke patient who could have been saved, dies or is permanently disabled because they were treated in the wrong hospital. But we are working together to change this.

As first medical contact, the actions of emergency service providers are crucial for the outcomes of stroke patients. Proper diagnosis, choosing the most appropriate hospital, recording the patient's medical history and prenotification of the hospital are all essential for fast and effective stroke treatment.

Monitoring care and sharing data between emergency medical services and hospitals allow clinicians to review, standardise, troubleshoot, and modify their stroke patient pathway to ensure services are being adequately delivered. However, quality monitoring isn't yet common practice in all countries.

WHAT ARE THE EMS ANGELS AWARDS?

The EMS Angels Awards are part of the wider Angels Initiative. The awards were launched in 2021 to acknowledge EMS teams that provide outstanding care to stroke patients.

The four main goals of the awards are:

- The implementation of quality monitoring in prehospital stroke care.
- The standardisation and optimisation of prehospital stroke care.
- The creation of an EMS stroke community nationally and internationally.
- To acknowledge the best-performing prehospital stroke care providers.


Awards criteria are based on international guidelines and the experience of our international EMS Steering Committee.
